Sample Size: Varied per area of coverage.




Survey Dates: July 15–19, 2025.

Collection Method: Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI).


This technique involved trained interviewers conducting structured phone interviews using computer software to guide the questionnaire process.


#### **70% Rural Areas**

A majority of respondents reside in rural areas. This suggests that rural perspectives and experiences play a major role in shaping the overall insights.




## Age Distribution




### **Educational Level**



The data shows a diverse range of educational attainment among respondents, with most having completed secondary or tertiary education. This indicates a relatively educated population with varying levels of academic exposure.


## **Gender Representation**




